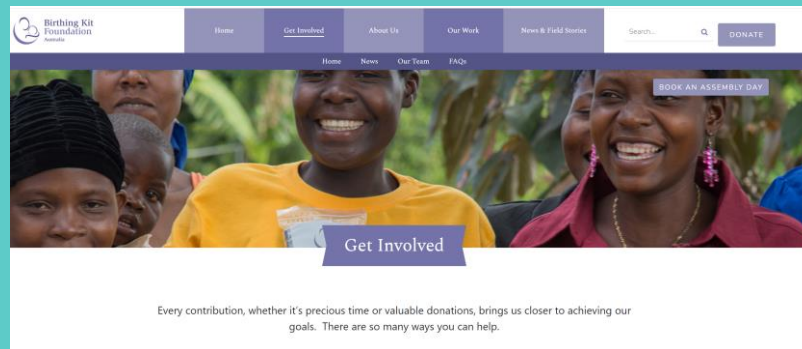

ABOUT KATE

Kate Banazi was born in London and studied fashion at Middlesex Polytechnic and Central St Martins College of Art and Design. Kate has worked from Sydney for the last decade on an art-based practice, working within fashion, music, illustration and advertising.



Her work is experimental, intuitive and often playful, with science, space travel and colour interactions key references. She celebrates the variations of hand silkscreen printing, exploring the layering of colour and graphic elements alongside linear grid structures and hand drawn forms, whilst showing the makers hand.



Workshop Experience

Kate has taught printmaking workshops for kids and adults for over a decade and enjoys changing the concepts and techniques for different age groups.



Program Plan (WIP):

For Kindy - Year 4

- Mono printing and dip dyes which students will use to collage and draw upon
- Students to swap work with one another to tear up and make collages out of, big posters and 'way finding'.
- Airdry clay and collage cardboard to create stamp sets they can collage onto small tiles of paper.
- Create a stamp and a roller (or a set of them depending on how prolific they are) which they will then print off onto multiple sorts of paper and create their own patterned papers.



Program Plan:

- Encouraged to try printing to other found substrate materials too
- Final edit of their choice pieces will be collated into a large print tile collage which they will help to design and configure within their groups.
- All the other years will follow the same principles but with adapted complexity

Year 5 - 6

- A version of previous program plus silkscreening
- An excursion to Aisle6ix for a t-shirt/skateboard printing demo.

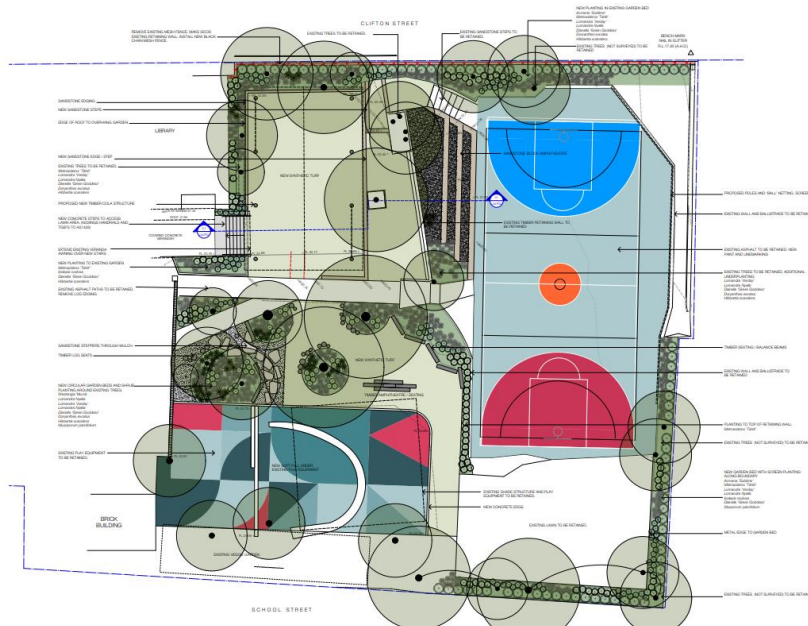
CONCEPT

OUTDOOR MASTERPLAN WORKS

UPDATE

- Dept of Assets now engaged and actively pushing the project.
- Total budget of approved P&C funds + school/dept funds:
 - \$90,000 school
 - \$49,000 P&C sports court
 - \$110,000 P&C COLA (TBC with current budget)
- Initial discussions around sports court and COLA /amphitheatre being undertaken separately however no anticipated DA brings the COLA forward significantly.
- Final papers to enable work to be go to tender being completed
- Engineer on site yesterday to conduct geotechnical tests to understand underlying rock depths and reduce tender risks
- Focus to complete ALL elements within this year

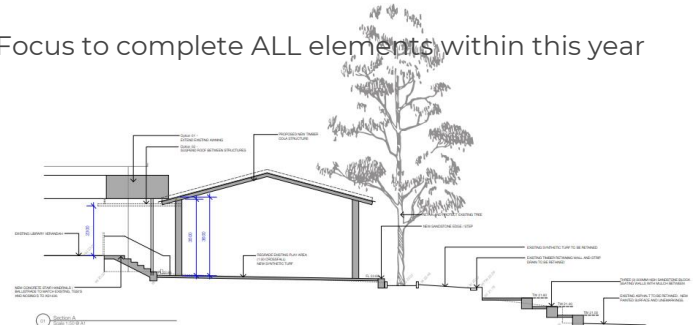

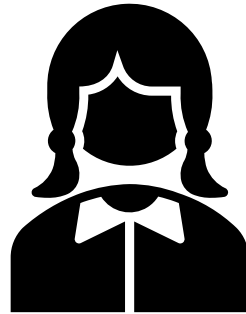
